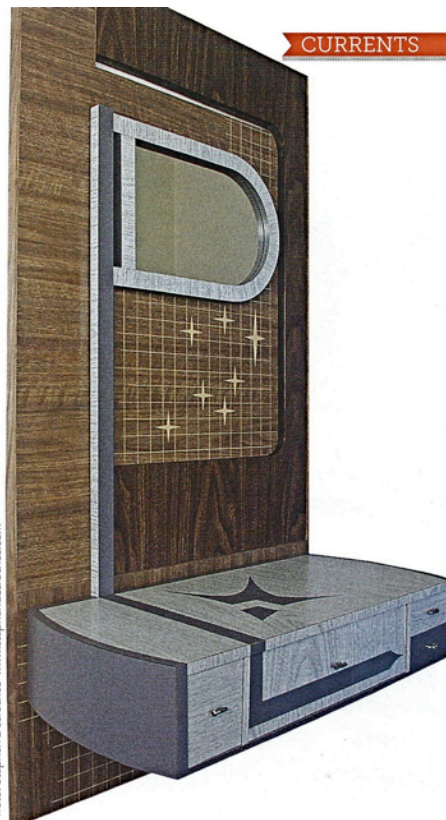


Form and function
